

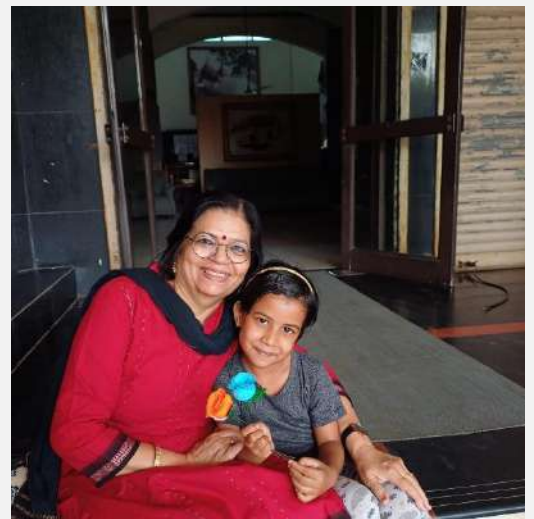


Deepsikha's E-News January 2025 to March 2025
